- Hours are approximate; Where a minimum of classroom hours are required for regulatory compliance, those standards will be met.
- Faculty represents our recommended number of instructors; Numbers can be changed at the client's request.
- Cost is based on recommended faculty, and can be reduced if fewer instructors are preferred.
- Cost is based on a class size of 35 students and includes all student materials and instructional services. It does not include travel, facilities or other expenses. Cost can often be reduced by scheduling multiple courses during one trip or reducing faculty size; Some courses can accommodate larger class sizes, reducing the per-student cost. <p>Advanced Disaster Medical Response</p> <p>This course was developed by disaster institutes of Harvard University and Massachusetts General Hospital. It provides instruction in disaster medical response principles and clinical care for commonly encountered disaster injuries. We consider it the finest course of its kind.</p>	8.0	3	4,200
<p>Disaster Staffing for Hospitals: Preparedness and Operations</p> <p>This new course provides instruction on using in-house staff and others to improve facility preparedness and operational capabilities. Content includes: ICS/NIMS compliance; Making the most of existing staff; Augmenting staff from other facilities; Union and contract issues, DMATs and CalMATs; Medical Reserve Corps; The California Medical Volunteers system; Unaffiliated medical volunteers, and; Credentialing.</p>	8.0	2	2,700
<p>Hazardous Materials First Responder Operational (FRO)</p> <p>This course has become popular because it provides in a single day the FRO training usually requiring 2 or even 3 days. It meets all requirements of both federal (CFR 1910.120) and state (CCR 5192q) regulations, and is geared for those who may be expected to participate in activities to protect life and health after a release.</p>	8.0	2	2,700
<p>Hospital Incident Command System (HICS)</p> <p>PCTI has made the latest HICS training more student-friendly and interactive. This course is designed for increased student enjoyment, retention and competence.</p>	8.0	2	3,700
<p>ICS 100/200 Combination</p> <p>This course provides fully compliant training on introductory and basic Incident Command. As required by ICS training standards, it includes exercises and a test.</p>	8.0	2	2,700
